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## About Us:

Towards Future is working in the field of child education for last 11 years. Registered on 2008 it started to implement its work in different areas since December 2008. Mission of the organization is to create an environment where children and women can live a safe life with their basic rights. One of our main areas of work is to ensure quality education at pre-primary and primary level through our direct intervention. Accordingly we have set up our projects in five districts of West Bengal – North & South 24 parganas, Nadia, Birbhoom and Darjeeling. We try to engage local partners for smooth implementation of our activities. Our mission is to ensure "Every Child should be in School and Learn Well." Every year, we try to reach to the children who are in need, through our different interventions. Our programs include pre-school education, mainstreaming out of school children, providing learning support to both in-school and out of school children, support children to have access to books, protect vulnerable children and sensitize people against gender based violence & gender discrimination. We also try to motivate girl children and young women to be self-dependent through different activities. We work not only as service delivery organisation but also to introduce different government policies at grass root level.

## Key Highlights of the Organisation

Towards Future is working in the field of child education for last ten years. Accordingly different projects has been set up. We have six different projects – School projects (Pre & Primary School – Shishumon-BTF Learning Centre and Kidzplanet Learning Centre); Support Study Centre (BTF Kalyani and Amar Pathshala – Birbhum) ; Educational Learnings Centres (MUKTI project for the children of migrant labours working in brick kilns); Smile (Individual Child Sponsorship Project); Madhabita Skill Development Program (Women empowerment program – Darjeeling) and Udaan (Girls football – Mahammadpur, Rajarhat, North 24 parganas)

**School Projects:** We have two school projects named – **Shishumon-BTF Learning Centre** (A Play School) and **Kidzplanet Learning Centre** (A formal school for the children of pre-school age to primary level). Shishumon started on January 2009 and Kidzplanet started on March 2013. There are around Two hundred and eighty children read in these schools. Most of our children are the first generation school goers and their parents had hardly access to books. Primary focus of these projects is to provide quality education to the children in a child friendly environment and make them comfortable in school premises. We also try to engage their families to our project as they can realize the importance of school education. We divide our children in two major sections – Pre-primary (3 to 6 years) and primary sections (6+ to <10 years)

**Pre-school sections:** The curriculum for the pre-school children made on the basis of the curriculum of Early Childhood Care and Education Centre's guidelines. In our curriculum we focused on the development of five major areas of the children – Language Development; Physical Development; Cognitive Development; Creative Development and Socio-Emotional Development. We target the children to speak more and more and encourage them to observe their families, neighbours, environment, relatives, foods etc. Their observation power will help them to develop their language skills as well as their cognitive skills. We teach them through activity based learning classes and encourage them to participate in these activities to their best. This method helps their physical development, creative development and socio-emotional development. Along with our classroom session we do parent-teachers meeting once in every three months. This helps us to develop relationship with the parents as well as with the communities where these children belong to.



**Primary Section:** For the children of primary section we have four major subjects – Language (Vernacular & English); Maths and Social Studies. Our major focus lays on their mother tongue (Bengali). We strongly believe that if a child can read, write and express his/her thoughts in his/her mother tongue, s/he will be able to pick up

other subjects with ease. To improve reading comprehension is our main focus. If a child enjoy reading texts, the chances of school dropout can be minimised. We want to make them enjoyable not only to their texts, but also to read story books, papers, magazines etc. After completion of four successful academic years we admit them in nearby government sponsored/aided high schools. Sarvo Siksha Aviyan's curriculum has been followed primary section.



Beside regular class we organize extra-curricular classes on every alternate Saturday. Children enjoy their drawing class, music & dance class, drama class etc. These classes help them to develop their aesthetic and creative skills.



**BTF Kalyani is a support study center** for the children who have enrolled their name in school but do not have anyone in their family who can guide them on regular way. Class bunk is very common phenomenon of these children. As a result they failed to follow their lesson and losing their interest in school. It creates a chance to get off from school. It turns to school dropout. Our support center helps these children to meet up this gap and encourage them to be in school in regular way.

**Smile – An Individual Child Sponsorship Program.** Towards Future supports children who require help for continuing education through this program. Right at this moment we have eight such sponsored children. We look forward to have more such sponsorship in near future.



**Project Mukti** – This project is an initiative to promote educational rights of the children of migrant labours working in the brick kilns. TF runs six such centers in North and South 24 parganas. Through this program we cover more than 400 children directly and two hundred and fifty families. Ensuring their child rights is the main focus of this project. Child Fund Germany and Wipro Cares are supporting us to run this project. Children from Bihar and Jharkhand come to these brick kilns and they stay here from November to June. During monsoon all children go back to their native villages with their family. This kind of effort help them to improve their reading comprehension

**Amar Pathshala:** This is support study centre for the tribal children. These children are first generation school goers. The medium of teaching in their school is Bengali but their mother tongue is Santali. It creates a problem in their learning process. So they have trend to miss their school quite often. Their parents are helpless to motivate them. Our project trains local youth (especially girls and women) who have completed their school education and appoint them for our centres. These young staff are comfortable both in Santali and Bengali. So they help little kids to overcome their language hurdles. By this project the attendance increased remarkably. Parents are also happy with this. Project opens a space for the parents to come to our centre in the evening for adult literacy. Initially response was very low, but now it is increasing. Towards Future is working in three villages – Swanahir,

Harhare and Kusbuna at Rajnagar Block. Through our project we cover 113 children. We work in collaboration with Swyambhar Nari and SOCEO.



**Skill Development Program for women:** This is a project which aims to help women to get empowered by their skills. In January 2019 we started this project in collaboration with Madhavita Rangeen Mach Chas Mahila Cooperative Society Ltd; SOCEO and Lemonaid ChariTea. Through this project we are providing skill development training to the women farmers by which these women can get knowledge on machine operation and online trading. We have a target to train 300 women by this project. The project is conducting in two blocks – Madhavita and Khariberi of Darjeeling district.

**Udaan** – A project for young girls and women which promote games for the girls. In collaboration with Metta Foundation, Towards Future started this project in the month of March 2019. Young girls love to play football like boys. But some traditional belief creates a hurdle for the girls of our project area. To encourage them and bring back their confident Towards Future formed a football team with nineteen girls named “Udaan”. Initially there were 14 girls, but later on some more girls get motivated with the project and joined Udaan. Now we have nineteen girls who belong to Islam community and dream to be a professional player.



## Events 2017-2018:

Throughout the year TF celebrates some programs in each centres like Rabindra Jayanti (9<sup>th</sup> May), Environment Day (5<sup>th</sup> June), Independence Day (15<sup>th</sup> August), project foundation Day (17<sup>th</sup> January; 30<sup>th</sup> March and 30<sup>th</sup> November) etc. Children celebrates these days with cultural program, sit and draw completion etc. Objective of celebrating these events to give our children an exposure to the social events. They get aware with these events through their performance and storytelling of the project staff. It helps them to remember these events so long. Through their performance we get an opportunity to explore their inherent skills which can be guided for their future aspiration. We organize some big events like Summer Camp at school project, celebration of Children’s Day, Annual Excursion, Annual Sports and picnic, Women Sports etc.

**Celebration of Bengali New Year’s Day:** On 15<sup>th</sup> April we celebrated Bengali New Year’s Day in each of our center. Children wore colourful dress, performed some cultural programs and received gala lunch in their centre. Beside that we organized Annual sports for the children of migrant labours working in the brick kilns. Around 50 volunteers from Wipro Kolkata joined with us in this event. The children who were not interested in sports, participated in Sit N Draw program. All children receive some token gifts for their participation and received food after sports. Events like 50 meters run, memory game, frog race, sack race, biscuit race organized for the children.



**Summer Camp** – Every year when our summer vacation we organize a week long year it was on 4<sup>th</sup> June to 11<sup>th</sup> June. The theme was earth gets polluted every day and what we should do. Each and every class of our centres participated practical classes on it. On last Day there was an assembly where students explained to their parents what they had learnt from this event. Parents were happy to see their children in this mode and children were confident enough while explaining their works to their parents.

### Fund Raising Event:



Towards Future organises different fund raising programmes throughout the year. During this year we organized three different programs – on 19<sup>th</sup> August we participated in a program at State Bank of India Airport Branch; On 26<sup>th</sup> August we participated in a program at Wipro Campus Kolkata. From mid of September to Mid of October we raised fund through social networking sites and on 31<sup>st</sup> March we organized a film screening program for the children to raise funds for our different projects.

**Health Camp:** Throughout the year we organized several health camps for the children. On 19<sup>th</sup> August we organized a health camp both for the children and their family members at Kalikapur. Smile Foundation was our supportive partner for this event. Through this health camp we covered 178 children and adults. Professional doctors like child specialist and general medicine conducted this health camp with their expertise. On March 20<sup>th</sup> & 26<sup>th</sup> we conducted Eye Camp for the children and their parents at our brick field project. GKB was our supportive partner. In these Eye camps 147 beneficiaries received services from the event and out of 147, 49 received spectacles from GKB.

**New Dress distribution:** On October 13<sup>th</sup> we distributed new dresses to the children both at Rajarhat and Kalyani. Hundred and fifty children received new dresses. Some of our donors took part actively. After receiving new dresses children received gala lunch.





**Children's Day Celebration:**



On 14<sup>th</sup> November we celebrated Children's Day through different colourful activities. At Mahammadpur the day was started with a procession of children, teachers and parents. The rally was ended up at Mahammadpur play ground where we organized Sit N Draw competition, creative writing competition. Two hundred and fifty children participated with their parents and relatives. Selective paintings and writings published in our Annual Magazine "**Ranga Pata**". We also organized another event in Kayani on the same day where we organized inter-scholl quiz completion. About fifty children from different schools participated in this quiz competition.

### **Celebration of 10 years Journey:**

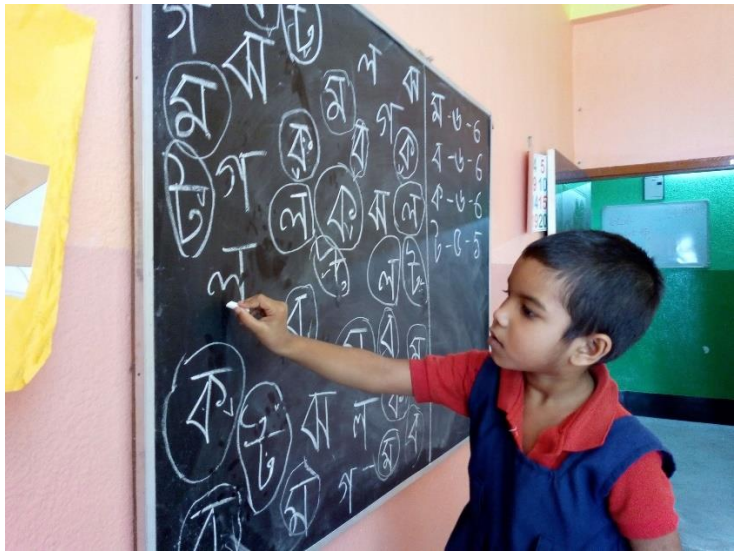
This year Towards Future completed its 10 years journey. On occasion of that Towards Future organized two days program on 14<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup> December at Mahammadpur and Rajarhat. Day one was for the sports event and day two was for cultural event. On 14<sup>th</sup> December morning a rally was roaming around the village where more than five hundred children participated with colourful balloons and festoons. The rally was followed by sports for the women and men and this event was inaugurated by Jt BDO of Rajarhat Block Sri Hasnat Ali. There were different types of events like Kabadi; Tug of Wire, football for the women. A team from Yatragachhi High School came to participate in Women's football. At the end of the day, there was a friendly football match between Towards Future staff and Wipro Volunteers. On Day2 there was a cultural event for the children and their families. In presence of more than 600 audience children performed dance, drama etc. The staff who are with

Towards Future from its inception were felicitated by the organization for their 10 year's services.



On 20<sup>th</sup> January 2019 we celebrated our ten years journey at Kalyani. The program was organized at Aurobindo Bhaban, Kalyani Nadia in presence of 300 audiences. The program was inaugurated by two Educationist Prof Bonomali Tripathi and Respected Smt Gayatri Chatterjee. Children performed dance & drama. Local vocalist also performed on that Day.

On 30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup> March we organized children film festival at Rajarhat Satyajit Ray Bhaban. Objective of this event is to create awareness on watching good movies. We covered 15 schools and more than five hundred children and their parents participated in this event. This year we screened three movies in Bengali, Hindi and in English. Children enjoyed all films very much.
